Prevention

We educate and engage parents and caregivers to protect children from sexual abuse through community and online resources.



Awareness

We drive awareness to motivate individuals and communities to take action against child sexual abuse.

Saprea Healing Webinar

Saprea's healing webinar is a 4.5-hour educational online experience for adult female survivors of child sexual abuse to learn about the impacts of that trauma as well as healing tools to apply to everyday life.

“For many, the healing webinar is the first time they open up about their past trauma and/or connected with fellow survivors. Many participants share that the healing webinar finally helped them understand that they are normal and that the symptoms of trauma they experience are normal reactions to abnormal things that have happened to them.”

Spanish Healing Webinar

In April 2024, with the help of generous donors, Saprea launched our Spanish Healing Webinar. The prevalence of child sexual abuse remains a critical issue, particularly in Hispanic communities, where cultural stigmas can hinder access to healing resources.

Lacey's Story

RESTORING THE VIBRANCE BACK INTO HER LIFE

Born in Oregon, Lacey's biological father trafficked her and her sisters from a very young age, eventually taking her mother's life and his own. Lacey and her sisters landed in the foster care system as young women. Eventually, she struck out on her own at age 16. Lacey spent the ensuing decade attempting to "undo and rebuild" the "warped belief systems and behaviors that were rooted in me."

Lacey eventually found herself at rock bottom, which included anxiety, depression, and turning to alcohol. It was then Lacey decided she wasn't going to live a "subpar life because of other people's decisions." That's when Lacey found the Saprea Retreat.

"... It was the first time I experienced a place that really brought it all together. [Understanding] where do your behaviors come from? What are my triggers? ... [and] bringing together components of healing. That was the most impactful piece for me."

Lacey recognized that she could use her skills and talents to not only tell her story of healing, but share it with others who experienced sexual abuse as children.

"When [I'm] feeling down, depressed, or anxious, [I] create rather than consume. I started out drawing... [it] was never any goal of being a professional artist. That's how I reconnect with that child inside of me. So, I thought about what Saprea is doing for women, [and] an image came to me of a child reconnecting with that young version of herself . . . and it's starting to bring the color and the vibrance back into her life."

Lacey shared her journey at the Saprea Gala in April 2024, and again at the SAFE Child Symposium in late October 2024.



Our Prevention strategy relies on volunteers in the community and key partnerships to help us create a safer place for our children to thrive. We understand that to make an impact in child sexual abuse prevention, we must work together.

2024 Partnership Highlights

The Policy Project

Saprea partnered with the Policy Project's Safe Child Initiative to advocate for SB205, a policy focused on prevention education for child sexual abuse and human trafficking taught within K-12 schools, including children, parents and caregivers, and educators.

The policy was passed, providing financial support for schools seeking to implement instruction and training in K-6 schools for children. Saprea provides prevention education for parents, caretakers, and educators.



Edovo

In 2024, Saprea partnered with Edovo, a national nonprofit and online learning platform whose mission is to provide free rehabilitation, upskilling, and education for every incarcerated person in America so they can thrive today and when they return home. Together, Saprea and Edovo launched a 10-module course, *How Can I Heal from Child Sexual Abuse?*, on the Edovo platform focused on incarcerated women. Edovo offers Saprea their platform hosting services, including reporting users' metrics free of charge. In turn, Saprea is one of the few organizations providing content for incarcerated women, specifically.

Our Volunteer Community Educators (VCEs) are committed to helping their community reduce the risk of child sexual abuse. They work to find groups who are willing to host them for a Saprea prevention class. Educators are encouraged to co-teach Saprea prevention class at least once a month.

Saprea has over 50+ partnerships globally supporting the eradication of child sexual abuse. Some of these partnerships include Stand Together Foundation, the World Federation of Youth Clubs, Compassion Prison Project, A Child’s Hope Foundation, Malouf Foundation, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, National Center of Sexual Exploitation, and Better Help, among others.



Cara's Story

Cara is an instructional coach at a local public school in Utah and a survivor of child sexual abuse. She has a passion for supporting children who have or are experiencing trauma. She knows it's very difficult for children to focus on being children when there is trauma in their lives, specifically child sexual abuse.

In her own words, "My perpetrator had infiltrated and burrowed his way into my life." He would show up at her school and park his car where the bus dropped her off. If she saw him parked there, she had to go with him.

"I felt I had no choice," she said. Upon her return to school, she describes herself as compartmentalizing the abuse and "getting my work done, because I am obedient." The teachers never asked any questions. Her parents assumed she was in a safe space when she was dropped off at school, despite her crying or being upset.

"I see these children who are living in trauma and how it impacts their learning abilities, and there are so many problems when it comes to child sexual abuse. . . . It is detrimental to your self-image, how you carry yourself, and experiences you attract that are oftentimes very negative."

"I wish prevention education would've been there for me as a little girl. I think it would've changed my life."

"Prevention education has to be parallel to everything else we're teaching in schools. We have to be very aware of the signs and what's going on in a child's life . . . it really takes a number of eyes to see what's going on. . . . It's not just teachers that need prevention tools. It's the office staff. It's the custodian, the principals, coaches. It's all hands-on deck. . . . Unresolved trauma devastates not just a person, not just a school, but an entire community and nation. It's an epidemic we must address." **CARA** ♦ **SURVIVOR AND COACH**

Through presentations at national conferences, including Stand Together, the National Center on Sexual Exploitation (NCOSE), the Global Summit, and the Prevent Together National Coalition Annual Meeting, Saprea effectively showcased their valuable resources and underscored the collaborative efforts underway to address this pressing issue.

Third Annual SAFE Symposium

Ending Child Sexual Abuse

OCTOBER 25, 2024

Loveland Living Planet Aquarium donated the space for this event.



This year’s SAFE Symposium brought together elected officials, nonprofit leaders, academic researchers, university administrators, and community advocates for discussions on what we can collectively change to keep our kids safer.

We welcomed advocacy figures at this event, such as Her Excellency Fatima Maada Bio, First Lady of Sierra Leone, known for her reform efforts and advocacy against gender-based violence in her country. James Dixon, a renowned author, motivational speaker, and survivor, spoke at the symposium, along with Lacey Byrd and Caroline Ashton, who both shared compelling accounts of hope and healing.

A key focus of this year’s symposium was the threat from online predators exploiting AI technology. One current troubling trend is AI-generated sextortion, where predators create fake nude images of children or teens and demand money to keep them private.

This rising trend highlights the urgent need for vigilance in protecting children from the evolving dangers of technology.

Several organizations were represented this year at the Symposium: Saprea, The Malouf Foundation, Prevent Child Abuse Utah, Policy Project, Utah Children’s Justice Center Program, Utah Coalition for Protecting Children, Utah Women and Leadership Project, A Bolder Way Forward, Generation All, Voices for Utah Children, Family Haven, and Adair Evans Law.



SAPREA SPANISH HEALING WEBINAR LAUNCH

Saprea launched the online Healing Webinar in the Spanish language. The Healing Webinar in Spanish allows Saprea to reach a more global audience and provide healing resources to those who continue to be impacted by child sexual abuse.

ONLINE COURSE LAUNCH FOR INCARCERATED WOMEN

In late November 2024, Saprea, in partnership with the Edovo platform, launched *How Can I Heal from Child Sexual Abuse?*, a ten-module course designed for incarcerated women in the U.S. In the first week, this course had already been accessed thousands of times, and many women were on their way to completion. As of December 17th, 2024, 7,378 participants completed the first lesson while 1,578 have completed all ten lessons.

MEN-FOCUSED PILOT SERVICES LAUNCH

On December 12th, 2024, Saprea launched a pilot in-person workshop, *Navigating the Trauma of Sexual Abuse*, in partnership with Wasatch Crest Men’s Campus. This workshop, along with a men’s pilot support group which launched on January 15, 2025, comprises Saprea’s first-ever men’s-focused services.




